DEVELOP YOUR CHARACTER

The Houston Christian High School community embraces a broad vision for leadership training. Each year, elected leaders of the student body attend seminars that focus on leadership preparation. Students develop effectiveness in group collaboration, listening skills, public speaking confidence and exercise practical application in campus leadership positions. The Leadership Challenge Series focuses on timely issues and ethical questions and is presented quarterly for parents and students.

Camp Mustang, a three-day orientation program for new students, depends on student counselors who are assigned various roles to introduce freshmen to the HCHS culture and to help them transition to high school life. Freshmen learn many school traditions, including Homecoming and Fish Day. Upperclassmen also serve on a panel to discuss important social issues, design the Freshman's Guide to Spirit and guide tours for the college visit on the final day.

HCHS's school spirit and campus environment are products of its student leaders. The Honor Council, a group of students elected by their peers and approved by the administration, serves to uphold the Honor code, hears evidence and makes recommendations on disciplinary hearings to the Dean of Students. Athletes serve as team captains and have leadership responsibilities on the Players' Council. Club officers plan agendas and lead meetings, and the Student Council is responsible for planning all student events, with guidance from faculty sponsors.
